

Syndal South Primary School Uniform and Dress Code

PURPOSE

The dress code at Syndal South requires students to wear a school uniform, which promotes a sense of belonging and fosters a sense of community spirit and pride in the school.

GENERAL AIMS

- To promote a sense of well-being which enhances children's self-esteem.
- To create a sense of equality whilst providing appropriate dress for all children for the various school activities and to be comfortable for everyday activities and weather situations.
- To provide an economical means by which parents may suitably clothe their children for school.
- To ensure there is a balance between the rights of individual students and the best interests of the whole school community
- To ensure students' appearance reflects the expectations of the school community.
- To ensure the school enters into and manages school uniform supply arrangements appropriately.
- To meet all human rights and anti-discrimination requirements.

GUIDELINES

- All students are expected to wear the school uniform during school hours, while travelling to and from school and when engaged in school activities out of school hours.
- The dress code will be communicated clearly to the school community.
- The dress code shall reflect the values of the school community.
- Some students may wish to observe particular religious and cultural requirements while also complying with the school dress code. These could: include: head coverings, clothing lengths, adornments such as certain jewellery.
- If accommodations of the dress code policy need to be made due to cultural and religious reasons, parents are to contact the school to discuss the requirements.
- The uniform shall comprise a range of options as determined by School Council.
- A list of uniform items and prices shall be provided to parents/guardians of incoming students.
- Any proposed changes to uniform supply arrangements will be clearly communicated to the school community.

- For school families who may have difficulty meeting the cost of uniform items, the school will investigate options to support the family.
- Parents/guardians experiencing financial hardship are also able to access the State Schools Relief Fund by contacting the school Assistant Principal.
- The sale of good quality second-hand uniforms shall be available through the School's Second Hand Uniform Shop.
- The correct wearing of school hats shall be compulsory from the 1st September to the 1st May.

REVIEW CYCLE AND EVALUATION

This policy was last updated on 23rd July 2018 and ratified on 31st July 2018 and is scheduled for review in July 2022.
